You will need:

card,(could be an old cereal box) string or ribbon, a pencil and a pair of scissors, a glue stick and tape.

To decorate you could use:

Felt pens/coloured pencils. Have a hunt at home – scrap paper/tissue paper, old newspaper/magazine, foil or



anything to add sparkle - kitchen foil, pom poms, paper dollies.

To make your own bunting:

- 1. Draw a triangle or cut a trace a bunting template. Make sure you either leave a flap at the top of the triangle for folding over or pierce a hole either side to hang.
- 2. Once you have all your bunting shapes cut out, you are ready to decorate.
- 3. Decide on a colour theme and get creative!
- 4. Decorate your bunting background using paper and glue or draw a design.
- 5. Then add shapes and designs ontop of your bunting background.
- 6. Either fold the flap over, the back to hold onto the string, or pierce a hole either side to thread string through.
- 7. Then hang up in your window or home to add some colour and joy!





To decorate your bunting:

See what you have at home and recycle materials to make it stand out.

- You can use tissue paper cutting strips, squares or ripping strips, add glue and layer your colours onto your bunting.
- If you have any old newspapers, magazines or wrapping paper, you could recycle them and create collaged bunting. Using images, words to create abstract designs.
- Draw your own design and colour in with pencils, crayons or felts, or tea!

You could use the design templates to add decoration and shapes to your bunting – add foil, or anything else you have at home to add some sparkle!
